

A BRIEF HISTORY OF OPERA IN HUNGARY 2018

Beginning the 135th opera season

Two years ago, we celebrated the 200th anniversary of the publication of the play that was later to be used as the libretto of the first surviving Hungarian musical drama. And even though some form of opera performance had already existed in Hungary in the courts of the aristocrats and primates – for an example, one need look no further than Haydn, who worked at Eszterháza (today's Fertőd) – the first institution at the national level was the one which opened as the Hungarian Theatre of Pest in 1837 and was renamed the National Theatre in 1840. The opera company led by **Ferenc Erkel** and the dance ensemble led by **Frigyes Campilli** were given their own building and independence only at a relatively late stage, in 1884. But then they moved into the new building designed and built by Miklós Ybl on the “radial” avenue, and in doing so became the greatest of all of Hungary’s cultural institutions.

“THE PLEASURES OF CIVILISED PEOPLE ARE ALWAYS COMPLEX”

We can really put our faith in Géza Csáth, since, as an early follower of Freud, he studied the subconscious and believed that the mysterious world within us gives us pleasure. Opera and ballet, too, are complex experiences, as are all the arts. Now, as we announce our newest season, “Puccini’s Italy”, let us do so by reflecting on and responding to some lines from Csáth, that brazen, young and tragic genius.

“Puccini was in Budapest during the premiere of Madama Butterfly. While on a carriage ride on Andrassy Avenue, he stopped his coach and, seeing a young girl carrying an excerpt of the piano score from his opera Tosca under her arm, wrote into the score: ‘A souvenir from Giacomo Puccini, the wandering minstrel.’ This small scene from the past demonstrates to us the composer’s discursive temperament, mixed with a bit of affectation .”

Like Puccini, we too digress a bit: while our May festival, uniquely in the world, will feature all 12 of Puccini’s operas, plus a new drama and a Puccini song concert and oratorio, we would like to present the master from Lucca in the context of his Italy of verismo. Ponchielli, Giordano, Alfano, Mascagni, Cilea, Boito and Leoncavallo all get their deserved attention, as of course does Verdi, without whom Puccini never would have found his way to our hearts.

“So what do they do? They curse and insult those who, with their youthful tendons, climbed the walls and out into open space. They see Puccini’s weaknesses, but are incapable of noticing his youthfulness, his strength. Beckmessers will always quarrel with Walthers von Stolzing. But I’m not going to pester the man who can transport me into the chilly atmosphere of a winter morning (La bohème, Act III) using only two flutes by calling him to account for his use of open fifths.”

Opera lovers and ballet fans should not, however, hold us to account for abandoning other great creative figures, even if we’ve done so for Puccini. No! 16 premieres and 60 opera and ballet repertoire productions will take the stage here and around the world, featuring pieces from 16 different opera composers, and works from as many choreographers – all in a single season!

“It is possible to become disillusioned with Puccini. In fact, we must, because disappointments are the milestones on the path to wisdom. But the memories of those almost bodily pleasures that we receive from Puccini remain inside us. Like youth’s mystical dream, it is full of feminine forms, perfumes, incredible excitement and nameless desires.”

What pertinent lines... But we are far from disillusionment! Instead, this season is about a journey: in the temporary

absence of Ybl's great palace, the great tour of Hungarian opera and ballet culture is partly out of necessity, partly out of duty, and will feature performances in 20 cities in Hungary and abroad. We're also announcing programmes in ten of Hungary's county seats, and we'll pay a visit to the Opera on Wheels before continuing on to Székely Land. And yes, during the two years the Opera house will be closed, we will tour through 64 cities in 18 foreign countries, from Korea to Naples, New York to Japan, and Berlin to Berehove – and most of it in the company of Puccini!

“Let us recall the first act of Madama Butterfly. The piece opens with a fugue. Not quite a fugue, but a fugato. But it sounds like a fugue, and that's the point. Grotesque, interesting, gleaming. No one ever wrote anything like this. (...) This is Japanese figuration, it strives to be a Japanese gesture. Ethnographies and travelogues can't say as much about Japan as Puccini did in this first act, and he probably never even set foot there.”

Puccini's female figures... Each of his eight opera titles refer to a woman. This season – in our own productions and in those conducted jointly with Müpa Budapest – the female vocalists receive extra attention. Netrebko, Gruberová, Garanča, Yoncheva, Sümegei, Rost, Miklósa, Kolonits... And yet there will be no lack of tenors, who were so important for Puccini: big-name guests include Flórez, Sartori, Calleja, Eyvazova, Cura, Vargas and Grigolo. We'll see stage direction from Barkhatov, the staging of a new Hungarian opera, choreography from Balanchine, Forsythe and Eyal-Behar, and the return of MacMillan's famous Mayerling!

“While at the opera two years ago, at the premiere of Madama Butterfly, I saw people's faces, red and burning with excitement, and their distracted eyes, and in the prudish shame of their glances I observed the secrecy of emotion, but I really had to realise that the bowing, ‘minstrel’ before the curtain was a great and rare artist. Today, he belongs among the greatest.”

And so, we await you along with the best Hungarian conductors, directors, singers and dancers, with our collaborating guests from abroad, our contracted partners, our children's choir and youth ballet troupe. While we're rather homeless without our Opera House building, our eyes are fixed on the Eiffel Art Studios, moving forward toward completion, as well as on the preparations for the Hajós Street Üzemház, and the trial run of the Ybl Palace coming up this May. Then, Puccini can come again and bow with us, before you all.

L'ELISIR D'AMORE ¹²

The Love Potion (1832, Milan)

Setting out on its 2018 summer tour with its most recent series, Opera on Wheels will be bringing a new production of **Donizetti's** most popular comic opera to areas inhabited by ethnic Hungarians in neighbouring counties. This piece boasting unflagging success since 1832 has everything needed for carefree entertainment: a hopeless-seeming love, an intricate story, idyllic village life, a fraudulent quack doctor, an unexpected inheritance, humour and lyricism, as well as enchanting melodies like the famous tenor aria *Una furtiva lagrima*.

The story's protagonist is a poor village lad named Nemorino, who is hopelessly in love with the landowner Adina, who herself accepts a marriage offer from the brash sergeant Belcore. The despairing young man spends all his money on a "love potion" obtained from a charlatan pedlar in order to win the object of his heart's affections, then joins the army to get more money to purchase more of the "miracle drug". Although the love potion is, in fact, just wine, Nemorino's true love eventually wins out.

The bel canto master wrote the opera in all of six weeks, basing it on, along with **Eugène Scribe's** 1831 opera libretto *Le philtre*, an autobiographical episode: in 1820, Donizetti's career as a composer was threatened when he was conscripted but a wealthy Bergamo businesswoman purchased the promising young composer's "freedom".

The work was last staged in Budapest in 2000, by **Sándor Palcsó**. The Opera's new travelling production, directed by **Attila Toronykőy**, will be visiting audiences outside of Hungary's borders

Carl Orff

CARMINA BURANA ¹²

(1937, Frankfurt)

O Fortuna. Everyone is familiar with the overwhelmingly powerful opening motifs of **Carl Orff's** most famous work. But what fewer people know is that *Carmina Burana* was not intended to be an oratorical work, but rather a piece specifically intended for the stage: a work of theatrum mundi in which music, lyrics and movement are intended to form an indivisible whole. This is clearly demonstrated by the piece's Latin subtitle: "Secular songs for singers and choruses to be sung together with instruments and magical images."

The texts for these "secular songs" come from a 13th century manuscript of poems, discovered in Bavaria in 1803, which contains verses by travelling students and clergy in Medieval Latin, Middle High German and Old French. Orff composed cantatas from 24 of these poems, which are organised around the three main unified themes of "spring", "drinking", and "love". The composer uses simple, repetitive melodies, and plays with pulsating, energetic rhythms to enchant the audience with music that is sometimes amusing, sometimes bizarre, and sometimes ethereally gorgeous.

Tibor Bogányi, after conducting the piece many times, was so inspired by Orff's creation that a vision for a staged performance slowly developed within him. The creators have conceived a breathtaking spectacle to surround the three vocal soloists, the three dancers from the Hungarian National Ballet, and the monumental 120-member choir on the stage of the Erkel Theatre: six projector displays and LED walls will bring the "magical images" to life. This production has its sights set on becoming a global triumph as well.

THE VERTIGINOUS THRILL OF EXACTITUDE ¹²

(1996, Frankfurt)
Hungarian premiere
CAFe Budapest

American ballet dancer and choreographer **William Forsythe** started creating his own works at the Stuttgart Ballet and was appointed to the helm of Ballet Frankfurt in 1984, remaining the ensemble's pivotal leader until 2004. He regarded George **Balanchine** as his greatest role model. His works are characterised by the use of classical technique as a starting point, but then thinking them through even to the point of extremes. One example of this is his 11-minute piece *The Vertiginous Thrill of Exactitude*, created for three female and two male dancers: *solos, pas de deux, pas de trois* and ensemble pieces alternate without a plot to the virtuosic and majestic final movement of Schubert's "Great" *Ninth Symphony*.

A tribute to classical technique, this work is today considered one of the most challenging short ballets to perform. After *In the Middle, Somewhat Elevated*, this work is the second of Forsythe's works to make it into the Hungarian National Ballet's repertoire. The production is being presented together with *Bedroom Folk* and *Walking Mad* in the *DanceTryptich* dance show, and will also be performed at the *Pas de Quatre* dance programme.

BEDROOM FOLK ¹²

(2015, Amsterdam)
Hungarian premiere
CAFe Budapest

Sharon Eyal and **Gai Behar** are among the most exciting, original creative pairs in contemporary dance. The Jerusalem-born Eyal was a dancer, and later a choreographer, with Israel's exceedingly important Batsheva Dance Company before forming her own ensemble, the L-E-V Company, in 2013, with which she appeared in Budapest in April 2017. Her creative and romantic partner, Gai Behar, is a DJ and underground creative specialist in Tel Aviv.

In 2015, they composed *Bedroom Folk* for the Nederlands Dans Theater (NDT 1), a piece that formed part of the *Strong Language* dance show. Music, dance and light each receive equal emphasis in the choreography, which is little more than half an hour in length. The creation, which blends clean, uniquely designed and exotic dance elements and operates with suggestive colours and lighting, has a captivating atmosphere which is both serious and silly at the same time. It is controlled chaos which points the way to the future. This production is being performed together with *The Vertiginous Thrill of Exactitude* and *Walking Mad* as part of the *DanceTryptich* dance show, and will also be presented as part of the Dance Trend dance event.

LA FANCIULLA DEL WEST ¹⁶

The Girl of the West (1910, New York)

After watching **David Belasco's** play *The Girl of the Golden West* on his 1907 visit to New York, **Puccini** resolved to set this somewhat unusual love story of the Wild West to music on the opera stage. The world premiere took place at New York's Metropolitan Opera on 10 December 1910, with **Arturo Toscanini** conducting. The dramatic material proved to be a good choice, with an effectively moving plot and well proportioned application of dramatic tension that lead viewers to the denouement with a sure hand. At the same time, the very same dramatic content might have been the reason that melody, previously the decisively dominant element in Puccini's operas, lost its leading role as the vocal parts began to follow the meaning of the words and the emotional substance ever more closely, without developing into easily memorable melodies and with the orchestra also simultaneously serving this expressiveness more powerfully. The character of Minnie, nevertheless, is a highly suitable addition to Puccini's ranks of heroines: driven by love and passion, she thus has no fear of risking even her own life – and the work naturally has no shortage of great opera hits.

Still in his mid-30s, Moscow-born **Vasily Barkhatov** is engaged to direct successful operas across Russia and Europe while also remaining active in spoken-word theatre and film work. With productions at Saint Petersburg's Mariinsky Theatre, Moscow's Bolshoi Theatre, the Lithuanian National Opera and Deutsche Oper Berlin to his name – just to name a few – the Golden Mask-winning director makes his debut at the Erkel Theatre in December of 2018

Pasticcio in two acts, in Italian, with Hungarian and English surtitles

After the success of *Die Entführung aus dem Serail*, **Mozart** wanted to write an Italian comic opera, but it was no easy task to find a good subject or librettist. In 1783, he set himself to composing two new operas, but gave up on both of them. After completing nearly all of the first of the planned three acts (with no overture) of *L'oca del Cairo* – around 45 minutes of music – Mozart dropped the work owing to textual problems. He then set to work on the opera buffa *Lo sposo deluso*, but did not complete this work either. Of the intended two acts, only a fragment of around 20 minutes remains to us from the comedy's first act. Nevertheless, this is a fully polished work, with an excellent overture.

The composer afterwards turned his attention to *Der Schauspieldirektor*, and then nailed down his first collaboration with **Lorenzo Da Ponte**, *Le nozze di Figaro*, (Some say that *Lo sposo deluso* bears the mark of meeting Da Ponte, and might in fact have been their first joint work.)

The musical style of the two abandoned comedies can be considered a forerunner to both *Figaro* and *Così*, and sometimes one can even recognise the world of *Don Giovanni*. Although the completed parts were never staged in Mozart's lifetime, since his death, several successful pasticcios have been made of them. None, however, attempted to integrate only the two artistic fragments dating from the same period, even though there are possible points of connections, and the similarities of their stories to Seraglio is marvellous. An idea cherished by General Director **Szilveszter Ókovács** for 25 years, the Opera intends to present Mozart's thus-far unknown operatic work and, under the baton of **Pál Németh** and in a production directed by **Attila Toronykőy**, to inaugurate the theatre hall of the Eiffel Art Studios with it.

LA GIOCONDA¹⁶

(1876, Milan)

Amilcare Ponchielli was born at the wrong time: as **Verdi**'s contemporary, he had less chance to shine, despite being a first-rate composer and an excellent teacher who helped shape *verismo* composers like **Mascagni** and **Puccini**. Of Ponchielli's ten operas, *La Gioconda* is the only one that achieved lasting success and thus earned a lasting place for itself in the repertoire as the most popular Italian opera dating from the period between Verdi's *Aida* (1871) and *Otello* (1887). The work was plainly conceived in the spirit of the tradition of Italian and French *grand opéra*. The libretto was written by Arrigo Boito (under the pseudonym Tobia Gorrio) based on Victor Hugo's play *Angelo, Tyrant of Padua*. The authors set the story in the magical, but at the same time, dangerous Venetian Republic of the 17th century.

The piece's protagonist is a street singer named Gioconda. In spite of her name, which means "the jovial one", her life takes a tragic turn owing to the intrigues of a diabolically evil figure who is hopelessly in love with her.

Ponchielli and Boito employ nearly every available trope of *grand opéra*: the carnival masquerade, the love triangle, unexpected twists, poison, a blind woman denounced as a witch, stirring crowd scenes – and dance: the best-known part of the opera is the ballet interlude the *Dance of the Hours*.

Even though the piece enjoyed tremendous success even at its world premiere, the author went on to revise his work several times. Now after a hiatus of exactly 20 years, the work is returning to the stage of the Erkel Theatre – this time in a production directed by **Ferenc Anger**.

THE GOLD AND THE WOMAN¹⁴

Az arany meg az asszony (1943, Budapest, Opera House)

When the weekly magazine *Theatrical Life* published **Gyula Krúdy**'s memoirs in 1918, the author described *The Gold and the Woman* as follows: "[This play] is a tiny whistle from the musical scores of long-gone centuries; a lace on a coat; a sound that recalls the sounds of the historical past." The play was premiered at the Apollo Cabaret, only to disappear forever from Hungarian stages afterwards. Several decades later, **Kálmán Nádasdy** suggested it to **Jenő Kenessey**, who turned the one-act play into an opera that was put on stage at the Opera House in 1943. *The Gold and the Woman* relates the story of a parable-like 15th-century love triangle. The ageing husband in a rather empty marriage takes his revenge on the young man out to seduce his wife by tempting him in a different way: by offering him counterfeit gold coins made in his alchemist's shop. Not suspecting anything, the elated young man chooses this glittering wealth. The husband, however, alerts the town guard, and the soldiers immediately arrest the greedy owner of counterfeit money. The married couple is left alone once again.

The Gold and the Woman is Jenő Kenessey's sole opera as well as a highly successful Hungarian work from the first half of the 20th century. The opera is being directed by **Csaba Káel** on the Bánffy Stage at the Eiffel Art Studios.

Gold and the Woman is being presented together on the same nights with **Péter Tóth**'s work *The Tót Family*.

THE TÓT FAMILY ¹⁴

Tóték (2019, Budapest)

World premiere

“Lajos Tót (...) is just a local firefighter in a mountain village. Meaning that he never offended the gods. What was his sin then? His sin, if he had any, was that he lived in an age when there was only one choice: one could either be a rebel or be Sisyphus. (...) There are happy nations: they are the ones who rebel at the right time. We are the kind of people who rebel at the wrong time,” – writes **István Örkény** in the short prologue to the tragicomedy.

Mátraszentanna is a place where only penniless officials and pensioners spend their holidays. For the locals, it seems like a miracle when they get the chance to host a real army major. Yet, one day, Major Varró – at the urging of Gyula Tót, who is serving as an ensign on the Eastern Front – comes on a visit to spend his two-week sick leave with the boy’s parents. The Tót couple do everything humanly possible for the sake of their son, and the deeply touched Major gives them his promise: when the cold weather arrives, he will assign the boy to the well-heated battalion office, where his life will not be in danger. The parents do not yet know that all this is in vain: Ensign Gyula Tót has been killed in action.

A few years after the success of his fairy tale opera *Prince Árgyélus*, composer **Péter Tóth**, who also serves as dean of the University of Szeged’s faculty of music, set to work on composing an “adult” one-act piece. *The Tót Family* is one of the most important novellas and plays in Hungarian literature, which now, following the emblematic Fábri-Latinovits film and a slew of theatrical productions still competing with each other to this day, has found a place for itself in the genre of opera in a production being directed by **Csaba Káel**.

George Balanchine/Léo Delibes

SYLVIA PAS DE DEUX ¹²

(1950, New York)

Hungarian premiere

As well as reinvigorating classical ballet with his unique choreography, **George Balanchine** also often re-interpreted popular themes from the history of ballet, and is now known as the creator of neoclassical dance. From the mythological love story, **Léo Delibes** created a full ballet, *Sylvia, ou la Nympe de Diane*, which premiered in Paris in 1876, with choreography from **Louis Mérante**. Global success only came decades later, in 1952, when *Sylvia* was brought to London with the choreography of **Sir Frederick Ashton** situated on a richly illustrated stage. It has since become one of the most commonly performed and reinterpreted ballets and also inspired **László Seregi**, whose exciting “*theatre within a theatre*” comedy is still performed at the Opera today.

Balanchine’s “pure dance” choreography is particularly special, as it was created in 1950 for two artists of the New York City Ballet before the ballet had achieved such success, while as a pearl of classic ballet it stands apart from the master’s modern and avant-garde creations. *Sylvia Pas de Deux* is taken from the third act of the original ballet and features a stand-alone performance from the nymph and her love, a shepherd boy, during a Bacchanal. The 12-minute work follows the traditional structure of the *pas de deux* and requires technical virtuoso ability and a refined performance style. It is a genuine technical feat, and will be performed for the first time ever in Hungary as a bonus performance from the soloists of the Hungarian National Ballet.

This piece can be seen during the OMG dance show, which also features choreography from **George Balanchine**’s *Theme and Variations* and **Harald Lander**’s *Études*.

MANON LESCAUT ¹⁶

(1893, Turin)

In the spring of 1889, **Puccini** was working on revising *Edgar* in order to find remedies for the causes of the subdued critical reaction – which were chiefly attributable to the weaknesses in the libretto – but by the summer he was looking for a new subject. At the suggestion of **Ferdinando Fontana** – who had written the libretto for *Edgar* – his choice fell on the Abbé Prévost novel *L'histoire du chevalier des Grieux et Manon Lescaut*. His wavering trust in the librettists, however, left its mark on the work process: Puccini “went through” three writers in three years, and he himself ended up taking on a major role in shaping the libretto.

Puccini's imagination was captivated by the love story of Manon Lescaut and the Chevalier des Grieux, in which the protagonists defy social norms and the accepted moral law in order to be with each other, as a similar tale of passion had taken place in the composer's own life: his affair with **Elvira Bonturi**, a liaison that stirred enormous emotions in him but which, owing to the strictness of Italian law, could not become an official marriage, filled his life. More than one associate tried to talk him out of using the subject, not only because of his own personal proximity to it, but because of the tremendous success of **Massenet's** own *Manon* as well. Fortunately, however, Puccini could not be swayed, and his first nationwide success was born, and was soon conquering stages all over the world.

After a hiatus of several years, the Opera's audience will get to see this work once again, this time in a fresh production directed by **Máté Szabó**.

Torre del Lago, 1908. Elvira, the wife of the world famous composer **Giacomo Puccini**, is teetering on the edge of madness. After numerous – justified – attacks of jealousy, Doria, the maid, becomes the subject of her suspicions. As his family life becomes unbearable, Puccini, hidden away in a tiny village, decides to escape to Paris. Elvira doesn't believe Puccini's denials, and attacks the girl with ever increasing ferocity. Doria has been in their service for years but now leaves. With suspicion mounting in the village, she eventually seeks solace in suicide: she drinks poison and takes several days to die. Elvira flees from the scandal to Milan, while the autopsy reveals that the 21-year-old “little Liù” who was so close to Puccini's heart, had died a virgin. Later the girl's family initiates a lawsuit, threatening Elvira with five years in prison, until under pressure from the Puccinis they withdraw the accusations. 15 years later, as Puccini is dying, he writes the opera *Turandot*, writing the character of Liù in memory of the death of the innocent Doria. This would become the last page of music he would ever score.

The Opera takes its role as a patron of the arts seriously, and starting from 2018, is seeking to support contemporary Hungarian literature and promote opera with situational dramas inspired by the history of opera. For the “Around the Ring” season in 2018, the Opera ordered a drama from **Balázs Szálinger**, one of the most talented authors in Hungary, on the relationship between Wagner and Nietzsche. Szálinger's second drama will be part of the “Puccini's Italy” season. After last year's beautiful serenade, *Siegfried Idyll*, Puccini's beautiful string music and the famous excerpt from *Turandot* known as “Liù's Death Scene” will play along with the dramatic events of *Chrysanthemums*.

EDGAR ¹⁶

(1889, Milan)

PucciniLateNight

Edgar is **Puccini's** most rarely performed opera and also his most debated one. He himself was dissatisfied with it and revised it several times, decades later writing the dedication "May God protect you from this opera" in the score he sent to his good friend **Sybil Seligman**. Nevertheless, he had thrown himself enthusiastically into composing it after the success of *Le Villi*.

Although the publisher, Ricordi, furnished him with an advance to write the work, personal difficulties and disputes with the librettist mean that the four-act opera would only be completed after the deadline. While *Edgar* was well received by the La Scala audience at its premiere, critics denounced its dramaturgy even as they valued the musical shaping, which is rich in dramatic effects, lavishing praise especially on the requiem. (**Arturo Toscanini** conducted this funeral march by Puccini's catafalque.)

Set in 14th-century Flanders, the story's characters bear revealing names. Edgar (wealth), the "anti-hero" destined for victory and loved by two women who want him for themselves, abandons the embodiment of pure love, Fidelia (faithfulness) for the demonic courtesan Tigrana (the tigress). This leads to all the complications and the moral questions they raise: the burning down of the home, the protagonist enlisting as a soldier to escape from a lover he is now tired of and having himself declared dead, later taking part in his own funeral in disguise, being shamed as a traitor, the bribery of Tigrana, and finally, the murder.

Edgar has only been presented in Hungary once, at a semi-staged concert version at the Opera House as part of the 2008 Budapest Spring Festival. Now, a decade later, it is returning to the Opera, this time in a fully staged co-production with Hungary's arts academies, as part of the *LateNight* series.

"Perhaps, like the swallow, you will wander across the sea, to the pure country of dreams, toward the sun, toward love..." is how the symbolic prophecy if the poet Prunier goes in the beginning of *La Rondine*, Puccini's sole work to start life as an operetta.

In the smart Paris salon of the banker Rambaldo and his mistress, Magda, the discussion is revolving around the vicissitudes of love and fortune and the choice between pure desires and the possibility of buying happiness. The arrival of a young man brings the debate to a boil. The company helpfully guides him into the night, where in the bustle of a dance club he becomes infatuated with Magda, "disguised" as a coquette. When she is unmasked, love takes them on its wings to the Riviera. Nevertheless, Magda's previous life seals its fate.

La rondine is the only late work of Puccini's in a lighter genre and was commissioned by the director of a Viennese theatre. Composed during World War One, the lyric opera was premiered in the neutral territory of Monte-Carlo in the spring of 1917 and won the approval of the Cote d'Azur audience. Although its atmosphere evokes the world of Viennese operetta, its plot set in Paris and on the Riviera is more reminiscent of *La bohème* and *La Dame aux Camélias*. With virtuosic ease he weaves into his remarkably scored symphonic compositional elements of contemporary dance music, including the waltz, tango, polka and foxtrot.

The Opera is now giving the work its first Hungarian staging since it was first presented in this country in 1927 at the City Theatre, in a production directed by **Ferenc Anger** being mounted in partnership with the Hungarian Opera of Kolozsvár (Cluj-Napoca).

L'INCORONAZIONE DI POPPEA ¹⁶

The Coronation of Poppea (1642, Venice)

The Baroque premiere for the 2018/19 season will be **Monteverdi's** final work for the stage; *L'incoronazione di Poppea* is one of the first operas to employ a libretto based not on literary or mythological sources, but rather on historical events: Poppea, the lover of the emperor Nerone, decides to have herself crowned empress, with her efforts ending in success.

Premiered during Venice's 1642/43 carnival season and performed again in Naples in 1651, this masterpiece actually vanished until its score was rediscovered in 1888. Calling the characters "famously problematic," musicologist **Tim Carter** declared the overall message of the opera "at best ambiguous and at worst perverted". Indeed, moving away from traditional literary morals, the adulterous relationship between Poppea and Nerone emerges triumphant in this work.

When it was created, the genre of opera was scarcely more than a few decades old, but many people at the time and ever since have praised the music of the 75-year-old master for its originality, melodiousness and sophisticated depiction of the human traits of its characters. These all show that *Poppea's* modernity has not changed a bit over the years, so it always affords exciting opportunities to those staging it. The work is being directed in the Eiffel Art Studios by **Kriszta Székely**, whom the Hungarian Association of Theatre Critics presented with its "Best Production" award last season.

"Thrilling and shocking" is how **Mary Clarke**, The Guardian's dance critic, described *Mayerling*. **Sir Kenneth MacMillan** created his fourth full-length ballet after leaving his position as The Royal Ballet's artistic director in order to dedicate all his energy to choreographing. The artist was inspired by **George Marek's** book *The Eagles Die*, with its depiction of the era of Emperor Franz Joseph and Empress Elisabeth, to present the tragic story of Crown Prince Rudolf and his young lover Maria Vetsera not in the customary romanticised manner, but in light of the social, political and personal pressure that weighed down on them. MacMillan fashioned the true story of the crown prince and his lover's 1889 double suicide into an intensely dark and extremely powerful ballet that many consider to be his most outstanding work. The sweeping power of the work's musical world is supplied by the music of **Ferenc Liszt**: apart from the perfect atmosphere it creates, the choice is an apt one because Liszt personally dedicated many of his piano pieces to "Sissi", the empress herself. **John Lanchbery** created the music for the work from 30 pieces by Liszt. The choreography strikes a balance between the massive and the intimate while also experimenting with expanding the boundaries of classical ballet. The role of Rudolf is one of the most trying challenges in the ballet literature, with the crown prince's psychological and emotional collapse depicted through seven exceptionally intense *pas de deux*.

In the view of **Clement Crisp**, with this choreography, MacMillan moved the narrative of the three-act ballet away from 19th-century conventions and the standard fairy-tale characters and into a format that better matched the harsher realism of modern life. Thirteen years after it was last staged at the Opera – when it ran for a total of 27 performances between 2004 and 2006 – the piece is returning to the Hungarian National Ballet's repertoire. This time, the audience will get to see the production in a brand-new implementation that follows the original designs.


THE HISTORY OF THE OPERA ORCHESTRA

The First Hungarian Orchestra

Any way you look at it, the story begins with **Ferenc Erkel**. He is the alpha and point of origin of institutionalised opera performance in Hungary – and to fulfil this task requires a large and permanent orchestra. The young pianist/conductor/composer was only 25 years old in 1835 when he signed a contract with the Hungarian Theatrical Society in Buda, which operated in the former Carmelite monastery in Buda Castle. Erkel would get to conduct Rossini's *Il barbiere di Siviglia* – a work with recurring significance in this story. Owing to the theatre's swift bankruptcy, he would spend a year as the music director at the German Theatre of Pest, which had been flourishing for 25 years and had a huge auditorium with a capacity of 3,200. His nationalistic feelings, however, prevented him from remaining there, even though they performed bel canto operas (like Rossini's *Barber*): as soon as the Hungarian Theatre of Pest opened and his contract expired, he signed with them. As early as 1838, he was organising the first Hungarian orchestra, the ensemble that played the operas, and, of course, a chorus too, because from this point on and for the next 70 years, everything would be sung in Hungarian to compensate for the long German decades. Today it is impossible to imagine that Erkel spent 46-and-a-half years in this position and conducted operas on 5,000 nights. The only reason these performances did not all happen in this building was the fact that in 1840 the institution was renamed the National Theatre by resolution of the Hungarian Parliament – in the same year when Erkel's first opera, *Bátori Mária*, was premiered. And it can be no surprise that – since the opera to inaugurate the building that once stood near today's Astoria had been *Il barbiere di Siviglia* – the orchestra, chorus, dancers and soloists would choose the same work to say goodbye to the building before moving to the new one on what is now Andrassy Avenue in the early summer of 1884...

In the meantime, many important events took place. After quashing the Hungarian War of Independence, the oppressive Austrian regime did not recognise any freedom of association. This meant that even though Erkel and

his opera-playing orchestra had begun giving concerts in the National Museum in 1853, it was only in 1867, after the compromise between Austria and Hungary had been reached, that the Philharmonic Society was allowed to officially register itself as an entity. During its history of 164 years, the Society, which was established on the model of its counterpart in Vienna, has been presided over by only ten president conductors: **Ferenc Erkel** (1853-1871), **Sándor Erkel** (1875-1900) **István Kerner** (1900-1918), **Ernő Dohnányi** (1918-1960), **János Ferencsik** (1960-1967), **András Kórodi** (1967-1986), **Erich Bergel** (1989-1994), **Rico Saccani** (1997-2005), **György Györfványi Ráth** (2011-2014), and, from February 2014 to 2017, **Pinchas Steinberg**. The orchestra can boast the world premieres of more than a hundred works, including such curiosities as the original 1889 premiere of Mahler's *Symphony No. 1*. In the spirit of its constitution, the Philharmonic Society pays special attention to new Hungarian musical pieces: **Ferenc Erkel**, **Ferenc Liszt**, **Károly Goldmark**, **Ernő Dohnányi**, **Béla Bartók**, **Zoltán Kodály**, **Leo Weiner**, **Pál Kadosa** and **Sándor Szokolay** dedicated or composed several works for the orchestra; and renowned foreign composers – including **Brahms**, **Dvořák**, **Mahler**, **Mascagni**, **Prokofiev**, **Ravel**, **Respighi**, **Richard Strauss** and **Stravinsky** – often conducted their works with the Budapest Philharmonic. Besides the president-conductors, several outstanding conductors have played an important part in the life of the orchestra, including **János Richter**, **Artur Nikisch**, **Sergio Failoni** and **Otto Klemperer**, and it would be almost impossible to list all the famous conductors, instrumental and vocal soloists who have appeared at the concerts of the orchestra with the longest history in Hungary. For more than a century, the Opera's orchestra, while also functioning as a symphonic concert ensemble, operated as the only professional philharmonic orchestra in Hungary. Today, it is one of around 20 orchestras, but still the biggest with the most performances, and capable of not just playing its speciality of opera and ballet music, as well as lighting up any symphonic or oratorio concert.

It is only effective, though, if the experience is enhanced later in music lessons and then with the Opera Ambassador programme and culminates at the OperaAdventure performances for 15-year-olds at the Erkel Theatre. So, a lot depends on the quasi "clown doctors", the artists who often do several performances a day, week after week.

Young People at the Erkel

The 2018-2019 school year brings the seventh season of OperAdventure, the largest theatrical education programme in Hungary. Tens of thousands of students have come from all over the country using discounted tickets for train and public transport, to take part in an opera experience of a lifetime at the Erkel Theatre. In spring of 2014, the programme expanded even further as several public collections opened their doors to the participants of OperAdventure. Thus, the initiative matured into a full-scale cultural adventure.

If the school's curriculum does not preclude learning off-site, then the programmes outlined in the information pack are eligible to qualify as teaching hours according to the given school's local teaching programme. So far, we've hosted 220 towns and cities, 750 schools, and 260,000 students. The autumn Adventure during the refurbishment of the Opera did not take place, so we are doubling up in terms of anticipation and excitement for the spring programme.


The OperAdventure returns with another rendition of *Háry János*, just as in May 2013, six years ago.

This programme was born from both impossibilities and opportunities, because while we were planning it, it became clear that the renovation of our Opera House on Andrassy Avenue would not be completed in 2018, as we had originally wished. This also makes it impossible to realise our production of *Götterdämmerung*, which we had intended to serve as the climax of our 2017/18 "Around the Ring" season, because the orchestra pit of the Erkel Theatre is inadequate for the size of the orchestra required, and, in its present state, the building's stage is also not suitable for rounding out our *Ring*. We are therefore organising a large-scale concert version presenting an overview of the entire *Ring* and featuring our finest singers. KÁDÁR'S (VERY) LAST SPEECH

Mihály Kornis's book of the same title, published more than ten years ago, contains the script, sound material and analysis of János Kádár's last speech in May 1989. The main character of it is the General Party Secretary, whose rambling, often incoherent speech hangs heavy with the weight of crimes committed decades previously. Two Shakespearean chamber dramas were merged here: that of a dictator unable to truly repent at the end of his life and that of the rising young Communist, who has the "internal enemy" executed with the same cruel cynicism with which he would be unable to account for his deeds later on. Historian and documentary filmmaker Tamás Novák directed his first play for the stage on the occasion of the 60th anniversary of the 1956 revolution in a special venue: underneath the auditorium where communist dictator Mátyás Rákosi's 60th birthday was also celebrated. (The Trapezium Room under the stalls does not exist anymore: it was demolished during the reconstruction works.) On the 60th anniversary of the execution of the leaders of the Hungarian Revolution on 16 June 1958, the piece will be performed again at the Erkel Theatre, a building that bore witness to the events of the revolution taking place on what was then called "Republic" Square. The performance begins at the early hour when the execution began.

We travelled around seven neighbouring countries and strengthens them, and it meant a great deal to us too to perform before our fellow Hungarians in remote sports halls. We will be continuing this endeavour with our Opera on Wheels programme: our special lorry that can be converted into a stage can drive to the main square of any small community, and we can please the audience seated around us with our brand-new Italian opera production sung in Hungarian (with Romanian surtitles) – now in the open air and free of charge!

Visiting the Ukrainian border region during the First Carpathian Homeland Tour, we could really only spend time in Ungvár (Uzhorod) – and we have wonderful memories of the two performances there with the audiences totalling 3,000 in number – and not much in Beregszász (Berehove). However, we did visit this beautiful small town and found there an open-air arena that could house an audience of 3000 in a nice, hilly location. Its conditions are not too heartening, but with support from Hungary and in line with the intentions of the town's ethnic Hungarian leadership, we saw that it could be renovated. After replacing some wooden boards, painting, fixing the lighting and cutting the grass, this site will be ready for use as a regular performance venue soon. The financial backing is being provided by Berehove's sister city, Budapest's District 9 (Ferencváros), and the Ministry of Human Capacities. The Opera and the National Theatre are both undertaking to visit the town once a year to offer cultural gifts from the homeland to those who have been maintaining themselves and their Hungarian identity under harsher and poorer conditions than anywhere else for a long time.

ERKEL: ERZSÉBET – LIVE RECORDING

Our institution pays a special tribute to our first general director each year and builds up the cult of the father of the Hungarian national romantic opera, who is one and the same person: Ferenc Erkel. We will continue the series, which is made for present and posterity with the aim of immortalising Erkel’s operas – this time with a recording of *Erzsébet*. This work has had an unusual fate as it is about the great Saint of the Árpád dynasty, but the gradual thaw of the oppressive Alexander Bach regime, the upcoming compromise with Vienna and the royal couple’s visit made its conception possible: therefore in this lyrical work we can also recognise a homage to Queen Elizabeth, or Sissi, who had a special affinity for Hungarians. The structure of the opera is interesting: Erkel composed only Act Two, while the first and last were written by the Doppler brothers. Although no recordings of it have been made to date, musicologists claim that Erkel’s act in *Erzsébet* might well be the most beautiful he ever composed, a composition rivaling the quality of *Bánk Bán*. We will soon find out.

For many years now, Hungarians living abroad have been invited to an opening performance at the Opera House, an institution always looking to enhance its role in Hungarian culture. 

THE HUNGARIAN STATE OPERA IN NEW YORK

Great achievements and great risk are both part and parcel of this amazingly big opportunity: an old dream will come true at the end of 2018 when we bring *Bánk Bán* and some of our other Hungarian operas to the stage of the David H. Koch Theater in New York, followed by a ballet week featuring our international productions. The Koch Theater – formerly named the New York State Theater – once housed the New York City Opera and continues to serve as the home base for the New York City Ballet. The building, which seats up to 2,500, is part of the Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts complex and stands opposite the famous Avery Fischer Hall, the large concert hall that today is known as David Geffen Hall, and right next to the Metropolitan Opera. With this trip, the Opera intends to get the unrealised American *Bánk Bán* project that stalled eight years ago back on track by taking it a step further and bringing a two-week-long Hungarian “season” to the heart of what is commonly considered to be the centre of today’s modern world. HUNGARIAN OPERA DAY

On 7 November 1810, Ferenc Erkel was born the son of a teacher in the eastern town of Gyula. Since 2013, the birthday of the father of Hungary’s Romantic national opera is celebrated on Hungarian Opera Day. This day saw the reopening of the Opera House’s legendary second venue, the Erkel Theatre on Pope John Paul II Square, the largest seated auditorium in Central Europe. On this day in autumn 2014, we also remembered another brilliant Hungarian composer, who – like Erkel – also made significant contributions as a teacher: Sándor Szokolay, whose *Blood Wedding* we performed on the 50th anniversary of its premiere. In 2015, we celebrated with another world-famous Hungarian work: the colossal oriental opera, *Die Königin von Saba* (*The Queen of Sheba*) by Karl Goldmark, who died 100 years ago. In 2016, a concert performance of Ferenc Erkel’s first opera, *Bátori Mária* was in the programme, and the studio recording of the opera, based on the critical edition of the score, was issued on the same day. Last year we released the massive Opera Vault series of 50+3 CDs to the general public. The series was sent to public libraries and the music collections of universities, colleges and secondary schools, and is also available for purchase at the Opera Shops. This year, we are including brand-new opera recordings of Erkel’s *Erzsébet* and Levente Gyöngyösi’s *The Master and Margarita* in the box as extra volumes. The internal awards of the opera, the jubilee golden rings, will be awarded before the performance, and the new Eternal Members and Master Artists will also be inaugurated. Of course, we will not forget to lay a wreath at the Erkel statue in the foyer of the theatre.

There are some cities which do not have an orchestra, but due to the size of the population or the available artists of the given period of the season, we cannot take them either a complete subscription or *Turandot*, which requires an exceptionally large number of staff. However, there are many people, some of them living across the border though not very far away, who are interested in opera. In this season that offers such special opportunities, we will visit these audiences with two real Puccini hits, *La bohème* and *Tosca*, which require a smaller chorus and orchestra than *Turandot*.

The work, or the works to be precise, that turned the two great artists' friendship into a rivalry that lasted until death... Because although Ruggero Leoncavallo offered the libretto of *La bohème* to his good friend, the young Puccini, he rejected it. Then he begged him in vain not to begin composition as he himself had already started... And it did not matter that his opera *La bohème* was highly successful a year after Puccini's, posterity voted for the composer of *Manon Lescaut*. However, if we take a closer look at Leoncavallo's opera, we will see signs of unfair neglect as he was also the composer of *Pagliacci*! The Italian titles of the twin-operas are identical (*La bohème*), so our predecessors have played them with slightly different titles, and, in order to avoid misunderstanding, we will follow suit when performing it close to the time of the other Bohemian opera.

We have found a special way to exchange guest performances with an agreement with the Deagu Theatre. The national operas of both nations will be performed in the capital city of the other party, but the local company can take part too, and thus, in addition to cost-efficiency, a genuine and organic cooperation and a deep knowledge of the culture of a remote country can be achieved too. We will go first: the principal musicians of our orchestra and chorus will travel to South Korea to rehearse and lead the ensembles there for ten days, of course with a Hungarian conductor, and then the soloists will arrive too. There will be a concert performance, but we will bring costumes so that the singers can identify with their roles better, and this visual element will have a special importance there, together with the Korean surtitles. We are also preparing background screenings and a short film about Hungary, Budapest and the Opera. What else could this pilot project take to such a remote place than *Bánk Bán*? This is how this season will be the one, which, in addition to Puccini and Italy, will take *Bánk Bán* around the world from Budapest to Berehove, New York, Naples and Tegu.

OPERA AT MÜPA BUDAPEST

From a professional point of view, one of the greatest successes of the "Around the Ring" season was the chance for the Opera's ensembles to swim in the friendly acoustics of Müpa Budapest. The audience loved it, and we took it as an injection of self-confidence, as the sound quality revealed that we are comparable with the front rank of the world's major ensembles. On each of those three nights, we performed a work that fitted with the season's theme Wagner knew Verdi's *Otello* very well, Strauss's *Die Frau ohne Schatten* is the Ring-like mythical world of an artist who was an avowed follower of Wagner, and Puccini's last opera, *Turandot*, was constructed along Wagnerian dramaturgical lines. As music critic and author Géza Csáth put it, "In dramatic terms, that is, the musical construction of the acts, Puccini follows in Wagner's footsteps." In the Puccini season, we have not created such a grand combination, but instead are bringing three masterpieces – each requiring a huge team – by three composers to the elevating atmosphere of this hall in order to provide a special, one-time experience to opera lovers and concert-goers alike.

In 2016, on this date of exceptional importance to Hungarian medical history, we invited representatives of the various medical associations to fill to the Erkel Theatre auditorium with members of a highly educated group that is well known for its traditionally close connections to the world of music – and we plan to invite them on or around this day in future years as well. To kick off the new tradition, the doctors were treated to Balázs Kovalik's now legendary production of *Turandot*, which was followed by another grand production, this time of *Aida* and a classic production, Puccini's *Tosca*, a year later. This year, doctors will be invited to a traditional grand ballet, the premiere of *Giselle*.

Hungarian-born Ferenc Lehár's strong links to the country and the Opera are well known: he conducted in the Andrassy Avenue building several times, and there are newsreel recordings of him conducting the premiere of his grand operetta *Garabonciás* (an adaptation of his own *Zigeunerliebe*) in the orchestral pit of the Opera House in 1943. Puccini, with whom he had close relations, said: had Lehár committed himself to opera, he would have been my greatest rival. Some of Lehár's works belong to those exceptions that opera houses can be proud to perform: such pieces are *Die lustige Witwe*, *Zigeunerliebe* and *Das Land des Lächelns*. The latter was premiered at the Opera in 1930 and now Müpa Budapest will stage this composition, which includes the famous song "Yearning for a Woman", after the expiry of the rights to Lehár's works.

ALFANO: IL PRINCIPE DI ZILAH



Alfano's most famous deed is probably that, after being recommended by Toscanini and at the request of the Puccini family, he completed the composer's final opera, *Turandot*, which had remained as a draft. For this, he had to be a significant figure of Italian *verismo* in his own right, of course, yet his works are rarely played. However, in a thematic season that selects from Puccini's era and country, there is an opportunity for this to be corrected, especially if we find Hungarian connections. In addition to his works popular in the composer's lifetime (e.g. *Cyrano de Bergerac* or *Resurrezione*), the conception of *Il principe di Zilah* were surrounded by important names: the librettist, Illica, worked for Puccini, and the publishing house Ricordi was Puccini's publisher – and the premiere took place in Genoa on 3 February 1909. The tale, which begins in the woods of the Bakony Hills in Hungary, is a genuine story with Hussars and Gypsies, and now is the time and opportunity to take a good look at it.

Some years ago, we celebrated the bicentenary of the birth of a great admirer of Italian Renaissance, the legendary Hungarian architect Miklós Ybl, who left behind not only his masterpiece, the Opera House but also such timeless works as the Castle Bazaar, St. Stephen's Basilica and the Danubius Fountain on Erzsébet Square. The concert was attended by an audience of engineers and architects, and we have been trying to make the Ybl Concert a celebration of the architectural profession ever since. Several days before the concert, the Ybl Prizes, the highest accolades in Hungarian architecture, will be presented: the audience at the concert will get the chance to applaud the winners. When compiling the programme for the concert, we tried to select from masterpieces of Ybl's contemporaries and often acquaintances. (Before the concert, representatives of both the Opera and the Ybl Society usually lay a wreath at the memorial tablet on the side wall of the Neo-Renaissance Opera House, accompanied by Italian Renaissance brass music, but this will not be possible this year due to the historical reconstruction of the building.)

SEREGI NIGHT '19

With this decoration, the Hungarian State Opera honours the memory of one of the most influential figures of Hungarian ballet, the internationally respected and Kossuth Prize-winning László Seregi, who passed away in 2012. The purpose of the award is to preserve and pass on his lifetime achievements and workmanship to future generations: the prize serves to recognise creative talent among the current generation of active choreographers. Each year, it is given to a single active choreographer deemed most adept at creating timeless works and artistic value with their own individual style. The recognition – which is permanent and does not pass to next year's winner – may also be awarded to artists working outside the realm of classical ballet, to contemporary and theatrical dance choreographers, for example. The prize is handed over with a statuette designed by János Krasznai to symbolise the workmanship of László Seregi, and also comes with a commission from the Opera House for the creation of a new piece of choreography for the following season. (The awards ceremony will take place before the performance of *Sylvia* choreographed by Seregi.)

PUCCINI: MESSA DI GLORIA & LE VILLI



Messa di Gloria acquaints us with the 22-year-old Puccini. It was no coincidence that he turned to church music: in his native Lucca, four generations of Puccinis composed church music. As a young boy, Giacomo sang in the church chorus as a contralto and began to learn to play the organ at the age of five under his father's guidance. After its premiere in Lucca, his mass was forgotten for many years. Some of its parts might sound familiar because he used them later in his operas: an excerpt from *Gloria* can be heard in the finale of the first act of *Tosca*, the melody of *Agnus Dei* is the Madrigal in the second act of *Manon Lescaut*, and in the church scene (Requiem) of his opera *Edgar* parts of Kyrie can be recognised. No retrospective Puccini festival can therefore be complete without this excellent work from his younger days, *Messa di Gloria*. The second part of the programme will be the concert performance of Puccini's opera *Le villi*. Between the two pieces, ballet scenes will be performed as it was a very interesting moment of music history when an opera was composed to the story of a formerly successful ballet, namely that of *Giselle*.

OPERA ON WHEELS I – CENTRAL TRANSYLVANIA, BANAT AND PARTIUM

Every Hungarian has both the need and the right to feel that they belong to a nation. This is especially important for those who must preserve their national identity in different country and cultural environment as a result of a historical events. The aim of this project is to present open-air performances in every region of the neighbouring countries primarily for the Hungarian communities living there, but also, since art is for everyone, with members of the local ethnic majority population welcome as well. The First Carpathian Homeland Tour of 2017/18 provided a special opportunity for both the audiences – totalling 30,000 in number – and the members of the Opera's company. We travelled around seven neighbouring countries and it meant a great deal to us too to perform before our fellow Hungarians in remote sports halls. We will be continuing this endeavour with our Opera on Wheels programme: our special lorry that can be converted into a stage can drive to the main square of any small community, and we can please the audience seated around us with our brand-new Italian opera production sung in Hungarian (with Romanian surtitles) – now in the open air and free of charge! To follow the first phase in the Székely Land last autumn, it is now time to visit the other areas with a Hungarian population across the Romanian border.

The Media Of The 3rd Millennium

In 2016, we exceeded 1600 subscribers on our YouTube channel, registering 380,000 views, with our videos running for a total of almost half a million minutes, which included more than 150,000 views of our image video alone. The number of “likes” on our Facebook page has exceeded 55,000 this year – the fan page launched in 2011 took off with astonishing speed, similarly to our official website (www.opera.hu) revamped in 2014. The number of followers of our pages on new social media platforms launched in the 2015/16 season – Twitter, primarily to address our visitors from abroad, and our Instagram account for sharing images – exceeds 2400. These interfaces will provide enquirers with a look behind the scenes of the Opera in addition to an official source of information. One of most important Google Streetview projects in Hungary in 2014 was to render the interior of the opera house: the platform now offers an excellent virtual tour of the building. In 2015, via Google Art, high resolution photos appeared on the internet as free content. If you have ever wanted to examine Károly Lotz's secco on the ceiling at close quarters with a magnifying glass, now you have the opportunity to do so.

OPERA DIGI THECA

The Opera House's History, from your own Home

While the concept of the exhibition and demonstration area of the Memorial Collection will soon be finished as part of the refurbishment of the Opera House, the archiving process of the objects related to the history of the institution continues: the material in the Opera Digi Theca is growing daily. More than 40,000 performances, 5000 artists' biographies, and almost 4000 photos, set and costume designs can now be researched thanks to the work of collection manager Márton Karczag and museologist Nóra Wellman.

By summer 2018, it will be possible to research the entire opera repertoire of the institution's first 130 years – the period from 1884 to 2014 - in the ever-expanding Opera Digi Theca.

OPERACADEMY

Accredited Further Training for Teachers

The Opera House feels an intense sense of responsibility to those teachers who have found their calling in public education here in Hungary, so it provides them with an opportunity to complete 30 hours of accredited further training. The programme first provides participants with a thorough working knowledge of a theatre's daily operations, and then leads them into the world of opera and ballet, all in a series of colourful, inspiring, and, at the same time, enjoyable sessions – in the unconcealed hope that, as a result of their experiences, the teachers will be able to transmit their new knowledge and enthusiasm to their students, thus ensuring the continued success of OperAdventure.

The further training includes observing two performances and the teachers will then receive theoretical and practical training, which includes both plenary and group sessions. Also included are discussion forums, workshops and rehearsal visits, a presentation on music history, advice on planning cultural programmes, a tour of the building, and personal meetings with artists, producers and theatre professionals. This year, as previously, the most important presentations will be delivered by the Opera's managers.

The Antechamber to Opera Membership

As early as the 2015/16 Faust Season, the Opera decided to take into its own hands the training of those fine musicians who are thinking about a career with Hungary's oldest philharmonic orchestra (which performs both theatrical productions and symphonic concerts). After having their applications accepted and auditioning, 8-12 musicians will be able to take part in the two-year training course under the guidance of the Opera, with a personal mentor assigned to assist with the education of the given instrumental part. The students will also be invited to play at various special performances, as well as participate in section rehearsals and other professional activities. They can also receive a scholarship for the duration of their studies.

The vocational director of the Orchestra Academy is the principal music director of the Opera.

OPERA ON WHEELS

Sometimes the Mountain Must Go...

After the Second World War, the artists of the opera resumed their activity with *Don Pasquale* – and three years ago we resumed ours with the same production. After several decades, Opera on Wheels returned to the road in 2014! The aim of the programme series is for a production to appear in theatre auditoriums of Hungarian cities where no opera company operates, but where the theatre's attributes (orchestra pit, wire system, lighting, acoustics, etc.) make it suitable for chamber opera productions. The travellers are on a mission: to popularise the Opera's productions and the genre of opera, in Hungarian. It's not a simplified version of a repertoire piece that the Opera is sending forth, but a production created specifically for this purpose, and that takes account in every respect of the capabilities of the theatre and desires of the audience by delivering fresh, youthful, and inspiring ideas and artistically devised technical solutions.

The production of *Don Pasquale* developed for the Opera on Wheels programme by Csaba Káel was so successful that we brought it to the Erkel Theatre, while in 2015 and 2016 we continued the series around Hungary and outside of its borders with a bold, new and humorous production: *Figaro 2.0*, with a libretto rewritten by its director, András Hábetler. While *Figaro* also made his way around the country last season, this year it will be *L'elisir d'amore* that will visit every theatre in the country equipped with an orchestra pit – up to 10 times in the course of the season.

OPERA VAULT

Archiving the Past, Saving the Present

Shortly after the change in regime in Hungary in 1989, the once-vibrant flame of the domestic record industry all but flickered out and the recording of operas, which requires unusually extensive resources, fell by the wayside. It is not so much the lack of the 23rd recording of Tosca that is so painful, since this is not terribly important from an international perspective, but rather the fact that we are deprived of recordings of the important Hungarian works of the past 30 years, and an entire generation of artists has also been almost entirely robbed of the chance to achieve some measure of immortality via sound recordings. The Opera Vault brand, launched in 2011, aims to end both deficiencies. The Opera, thanks to its incredible artistic talent pool, has agreed each year to record and release an entire Hungarian opus in a series of its own while simultaneously producing the work itself on stage. We will make a live recording of another Hungarian opera as a concert performance and another as a live staged production, release one of our archived radio materials and issue a memorable collection of recordings of an artist and a volume about the history of the institution. Our latest three-year undertaking is to conduct interviews with the Eternal Members, in which the members of the “living pantheon” will discuss their careers and help us select photos for the 30 publications we will be compiling; we will also publish illustrated books about each of the departed Eternal Members, with reviews and biographies.

In the past, the biggest Hungarian cultural institution's primary use for its own magazine was to offer its partners and supporters an exclusive advertising platform – and also to provide some information to fans. By keeping commercial considerations at arm's length, it has aspired to be a cultural magazine of quality and profundity that is worthy of the entire range of the Opera House's programmes, as it seeks to be much more than simply an opera magazine.

OPERA YEARBOOK

Record the Past

The Opera seeks to reinstate the century-long tradition of publishing yearbooks for each season, and at the same time to revamp the format. This is why it is releasing, in limited numbers, a series of album books comprising illustrated reports of not only the most recent season, but also the 2012/2013 and 2013/2014 seasons. The publication includes the five Opera Magazines appearing during that season, the season's Programme Calendar, and the separately produced inserts. The freshly printed summaries of the year's events are released at the time of the company's general meeting at the opening of the season. Collectors can purchase or order the print version of the volume at the Opera Shop.

YOU SHALL GO TO THE BALL!

Because at the Ball, Clothes do Make the Person

The Opera House takes pride in not only its own ball, but also in those of others. That's why it gives (primarily) high school students and non-profit organisations – on a first-come, first-served basis and between Epiphany and Ash Wednesday, 6 January and 6 March 2019 – the chance to borrow costumes from our collection of 400,000. These pieces, no longer used but kept in storage, might still be serviceable for the occasional ball, simply to be worn or just used as decoration or for a photo opportunity. The Opera does not charge a rental fee, only a preparation fee to cover expenses (Ft 2,750 per costume for cleaning), but it does request of the given institution or organisation that it set up a display stand offering publications and advertising material from the Opera House at the location of the ball.

As partner to the event, the Opera House will also provide admission tickets (a box for 6 persons) to the Erkel Theatre – to a performance of the Opera House's choosing – as the grand prize for the ball's raffle or other competition.

ÚTRAVALÓ (FOR THE ROAD) 2019

Music for Babies and Mothers

On 1 January 2013, the General Director of the Hungarian State Opera presented to the first child born in Hungary in the New Year the first copy of the *Útravaló (For the Road)* CD, which was also received by the family of every Hungarian new-born (whether in Hungary or abroad) in the so-called Promobox package. The programme has been a huge success to date and is set to continue. The recording, reproduced in 80,000 copies, will be followed by a new edition featuring brand new recordings from the ensembles and soloists of the Opera.

While we made our selections for 2013 from among the most popular Hungarian operas and symphonic orchestral works, the 2014 edition of *Útravaló* was composed of recent radio broadcasts of the Opera's Philharmonic Orchestra. *Útravaló 2015* was a DVD of the children's opera staged at the Erkel Theatre: *The Magic Flute for Children*. For the 2016 edition we selected the television recording of *Leander and Linseed*, the fairy-tale piece commissioned by the Opera from Zsófia Tállér, and in 2017 we chose a selection of popular opera excerpts with a dedication written by clinical psychologist Dr Emőke Bagdy – who follows in the footsteps of Ákos Kovács, Katalin Kokas, Barnabás Kelemen and Mihály Kótai. It will be the turn of the Opera Chorus in 2019, when the musical material will be selected from celebrated opera choruses.

TICKET INFORMATION, SUBSCRIPTIONS AND DISCOUNTS

SUBSCRIPTIONS AND BONUSES

In the 2018/2019 season, the Hungarian State Opera offers a choice of different subscriptions for old and new patrons. This season, the institution will once again issue collectible plastic cards of unique design and bearing the holder's name, which primarily allow returning Hungarian guests to obtain substantial discounts.

BONUS

All purchasers of subscriptions with a card includes a code providing a **30% discount** for the same number of individual **bonus** performances at the Opera House as the number of performances on their subscription. (For example, by using the card, the purchaser of a **four-performance** subscription for the Erkel Theatre may buy discounted tickets for **four performances at the Opera House.**) The bonuses can be used at the Opera House, which will reopen in the spring of 2019.

BONUS+

We've linked each of the subscription options to a single special opera event, which the holder of the given pass can register to attend at half price. **This means we've supplemented each subscription series with a 50% discount for each of our subscriptions.** (One subscription allows one bonus ticket to be purchased at the Hungarian State Opera box offices. Tickets are available in limited numbers: requests will be processed according to the time of booking; for further information on the booking system and the conditions of card use, visit www.opera.hu/vasarloiaszf. Tickets can be purchased from 2 July 2018.)

FLEXIBLE SUBSCRIPTION

Last season, our patrons were invited to sample **Flexible Subscriptions**, which turned out to be very popular. After the close of the several-month-long period for purchasing subscriptions, patrons can purchase Flexible Subscriptions for remaining seats at the **Erkel Theatre** for **six performances** of their choosing. We will provide a total **discount of 15%** for the six tickets, which must be paid for in a single sum in advance. Perhaps more importantly, we also reward Flexible Subscription holders with the 30% discount from the list price on six additional individual tickets to six different performances at the Opera House (Bonus).

SIX-PERFORMANCE CARD

Last but not least, the **Six-Performance Card** will be available for sale starting on 2 July 2018. This will be of interest to those of our patrons who missed the subscription deadline for any reason or who only occasionally visit the Opera House. Anyone who collects **six full-priced performances at either the Opera House or Erkel Theatre**, may also purchase an additional individual ticket for each of six **Opera House productions at a 30% discount** on their Six-Performance Card. (Since the Six-Performance Card is linked to an individual name, the owner only becomes eligible for the discount after attending six productions.)

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CARD USE

COME ON IN!

Performances at the Opera House have been easily accessible for young audience members and students since March 2012. Student tickets are, of course, available this year too during the modernisation of the building – this time at the Erkel Theatre. The tickets, which are available in limited numbers, cost 300 forints (or 1 euro for international visitors) and are valid for seats at the top of the balcony and the wing boxes. Thanks to the shoebox-like shape of the auditorium, it should also be noted that the acoustics of the Erkel Theatre are best from these seats. Student tickets can be purchased in person at any of the box offices of our theatres two hours prior to the beginning of the performances.

HELP FOR THE VISUALLY IMPAIRED

The surtitle screens suspended above the stages of the Opera House and the Erkel Theatre are a great help in understanding the works for those who can hear, but especially important for the hearing impaired. Our visually impaired guests arriving in groups can enjoy opera performances too: they will be informed about the events on the stage with commentary through in-ear monitors while being able to fully enjoy the music. The venue for this experimental project is the Erkel Theatre and it is led by Ervin Bonecz. There are 40 available spots for each performance.

Disabled lavatory facilities will also be available on the balcony level.





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OPERATIC EMPIRE

THE OPERA HOUSE


The Ybl Palace on Andrásy Avenue

Hungary's first opera house, and still the only one to be built in the country, was inaugurated after almost 15 years under construction on 27 September 1884. Only Hungarian artisans were allowed to work on its construction, using Hungarian technology and Hungarian materials – with a few exceptions – according to the patriotic regulations of the Board of Public Works of the Capital City. **Miklós Ybl's** Neo-Renaissance building immediately became a landmark of Budapest, and is still the second most visited and the most important representative public building after the Parliament. At the time of its closure in June 2017, its auditorium had a capacity of 1236 and the venue ranked among the world's top opera houses. The largest secco in Hungary can be seen here:

Károly Lotz painted the apotheosis of music in a painting with a perimeter of 45 metres on the ceiling, with excellent Hungarian artists simultaneously working in other rooms, including **Bertalan Székely, Mór Than, Árpád Feszty** and **György Vastagh**.

The most famous guest singer was **Enrico Caruso** and several world premieres of Hungarian works were staged inside these historic walls (*Bluebeard's Castle, Hány János, The Spinning Room, The Wooden Prince, King Pomade's New Clothes, Blood Wedding, C'est la guerre, and Mario and the Magician*).


The Opera House was last refurbished between 1980 and 1984. Scheduled work to modernise the building has been underway since summer 2017. In addition to general restoration work, all the stage machinery and mechanical and electrical systems will be replaced, several rooms will be given new functions, the acoustics will be improved, the historical layout of the stalls will be restored and the orchestra pit expanded. In addition, smart seats will improve audience comfort, low-voltage wiring will be installed and the limestone façade will also be renewed.



ERKEL THEATRE

II. János Pál Pápa Square

The theatre with the largest number of seats in Hungary, and even in Central Europe, was formerly known as the Népopera (People's Opera). It was built in less than nine months on a plot donated by Budapest in 1911. During the colourful history of the private enterprises that ran the business, operas, concerts, operettas, ballets, jazz concerts, dramatic plays, cabarets and musicals were staged here, as well as boxing matches, fashion shows and party conferences. The theatre even operated as a cinema and entertainment venue. Initially, the venue had 3400 seats, but due to the introduction of stricter fire prevention regulations and a more comfortable seating layout, the capacity has since been reduced to 1819, but it still preserves its leading position and legendary acoustics, and, with extra chairs, it can be enlarged to comfortably fit 2000. The Városi (City) Theatre, which was renamed the Erkel Theatre in 1951, has been operated by the Hungarian State Opera since 1949. **Reiner, Toscanini, Furtwängler, Fricsay, Gardelli, Ferencsik** and **Bernstein** have conducted here and the greatest tenors, **di Stéfano, Aragall, Carreras, Gedda, Pavarotti** and **Domingo** have sung on its stage, as have **Ella Fitzgerald, Duke Ellington** and **Oscar Peterson**. The theatre was closed down in 2007, but reopened in 2013 after several months of refurbishment. Ever since, it has been operating as an affordable theatre for Hungarian opera and ballet lovers, and this is the place where we nurture our future audiences. Folk dance and high-quality pop music productions appear here, too, as do opera and ballet performances from other companies. Almost one million guests have been through the doors since the reopening, and they can now come to the theatre by underground too. During the renovation of the Opera House, the Erkel Theatre will host most of the productions of the "Puccini's Italy" season. We plan to carry out substantial renovation work on the Erkel Theatre to make its stage equivalent to that of the Opera House in 2021/22, so the venue will remain in operation until 31 December 2020.



EIFFEL ART STUDIOS

Kőbányai Road

The largest indoor complex in Hungarian railway history, a system of vast covered spaces unique in Europe, and the Northern Railway Maintenance and Engineering works was built between 1884 and 1886. As activities on the 22 hectare site ceased in 2009, the government offered 6.7 hectares of the area to the Opera together with the five-nave core repair complex of 22,000 square metres, named after Gustave Eiffel, two auxiliary buildings, and a complete train station. The rehearsal, production and storage centre for the opera is being built here where the Bánffy Stage, with an auditorium with 400 seats, will be constructed to include a rehearsal stage of the same size as the stage of the Opera House and a music studio suitable for recordings. In addition to moving all of its nine production workshops, all of its sets, costumes and props here, the institution will also create a memorial room for **János Feketeházy**, the designer of both this building and the Opera House's iron skeleton. The Eiffel Hall, which was large enough to repair up to 96 huge steam locomotives at a time, will house a restaurant (in a vintage railway car made of teak), where guests can marvel at the legendary No. 327,141 Hungarian steam locomotive in the atrium and the No. 006 "Biatorbágy" steam locomotive of the 301 series in the park. There will also be a costume rental shop and a visitor centre. The training centre for the Opera will be established here too, comprising the Opera Studio, the Opera Music School and the Opera Education Center. The production studios will also function as a practical training centre, as we would like to train future generations of professionals in the ways of theatre production ourselves. A car park with a capacity for 200 vehicles will be built next to a park of three hectares where the famous viticulturist **Károly Bakonyi**'s grapes will grow together with **Gergely Márk**'s roses. A playground will be built surrounded by the halls, which will operate in a spirit of environmental awareness.

The Eiffel Art Studios project will be completed in the autumn of 2019 and, once the entire complex has been inaugurated, work will begin on the adjacent Hungarian Museum of Science, Technology and Transport.



ORCHESTRAL CENTRE

Jókai Street

The centre where the triple-sized orchestra of the Opera, the first and largest philharmonic ensemble in Hungary, rehearses for performances, galas and its own concerts, is located in Jókai Street near the Oktogon, not far from the Opera House. The building, which used to function as the headquarters of a trade union, has been managed by our institution since 2004 and is scheduled for refurbishment in the summer of 2019. According to the Opera Development Programme, in addition to the spacious Ferencsik Hall in the building, the Failoni Chamber Hall will also be operated by the orchestra. The building houses the offices and archives of the Budapest Philharmonic Society, and – according to further acquisition plans – rehearsal rooms of several hundreds of square metres will also be built on the premises.

OPERA SALES CENTRE

Hajós Street

Opposite the side entrance in Hajós Street, there is a block of flats designed by **Miklós Ybl** with **Károly Lotz**'s frescos under the entrance. The opera has been renting spaces in the building for some time, and in the autumn of 2014 we opened our modern Sales Centre, which is charged with the highly responsible job of organising audiences and selling single and subscription tickets. Moving the locksmith's workshop from this building to the Eiffel Art Studios will allow us to move other functions here, and the sales offices will be connected directly to Hajós Street.

ADMINISTRATIVE BUILDING

Hajós Street

Before the refurbishment of the Opera House in 1980, a 12-storey building was constructed opposite the artists' entrance in Hajós Street. The building, with its more than 4,000 square metres, was built in place of a demolished tenement, and it houses several offices, dressing rooms and rehearsal rooms of the institution. The chorus rooms of the Hungarian State Opera Chorus and the Children's Chorus can be found here, and the Opera House is heated from the boilers located on the top floor of the Administrative Building. The heating and cooling systems of the building, constructed in 1979, are extremely poor, the equipment is outdated and its refurbishment, the renewal of its façade and the change of function of some of its rooms, are important parts of the Opera's modernisation programme. A special feature of the Administrative Building is its connection to the Opera House by a tunnel under Hajós Street, which provides a safer route for transporting musical instruments and, in rainy and cold weather, a more comfortable way to reach the other building. Fireworks to celebrate the New Year are let off from its more than 30-metre-high roof every year.

When this publication went to press, the Hungarian State Opera had no choice but to rent property for its shoe workshop (Révai Street), one of the dressmaker's shops (Kenyérmező Street), the prop storeroom (Lázár Street) and all the set storerooms (six different premises in Budapest and Pest county, and ten buildings in all). In addition, we also regularly rehearse in other rented locations, such as the Tivoli Theatre, the Bárka Theatre, Duna Television, Hungexpo, a rapid-response police building, RTL and the Hungarian Radio – and will continue to do so until the Eiffel Art Studios are opened in autumn 2019. We will then return "home" to our new and renovated venues from 21 different properties.

Dés composed a varied, multi-layered soundtrack that recreates the Southern big band jazz mood of a New Orleans neighbourhood in the forties. As in Williams’ play the alternation of the rhythms, or leitmotif, follows the characters and the situations. The final scene is great, both realistic and brutal. Should you be planning to visit Budapest, this is a production not to be missed.”

“*3 Gnessiennes* was tailor-made for Maria Aradi, born Hungarian, so it comes as no surprise that it was chosen to open the triple bill. The host company also gave us an excellent taste of their ability: Tatiana Melnik and Gergely Leblanc were exceptional in the *pas de deux* from *Esmerelda*, and thoroughly enjoyable in Gustav Mahler's *Adagietto*, choreographed by Imre Dózsa. It was particularly worth watching the gala evening, where the orchestra gave an outstanding performance, conducted by Imre Kollár (except for one or two excerpts played from recordings). The public accompanied the performance from beginning to end with huge ovations and enthusiastic applause."

The orchestra, conducted by Ádám Medveczky, was stunning, brilliant – their playing alone would have been enough. And it was a special pleasure to see them given the absence of orchestra-level ticket prices. We had the chance to marvel, for example, on how much of a role the kettle drum plays in the Hungarian national anthem."

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CLOSING THOUGHTS FROM GÉZA CSÁTH ON PUCCINI

“The first acts of Tannhäuser and Lohengrin are built on excitement, anticipation, and on the changing relations of the situational and kinetic energy of human desires, with practically Shakespearean power. But Wagner was not always flawless in his accounting for the two factors of music and drama. Puccini, however, went further, owing mostly to the fact that he was born with lesser musical talent than Wagner. He was born Italian, which comes with a certain degree of artistic self-doubt, and a certain immoral dominance over the creative work. He is aware of the fact that around three-quarters of his audience is neurasthenic and hysterical, people who are impressionable and susceptible to one another’s suggestions. But the work itself does in fact contain neurasthenia and hysteria. Within the morbidly refined harmonies, is not the sensual orchestration neurasthenia? Is the prominent positioning of sexual issues, the torture scene in Tosca and the mauling of human souls found in all of his operas not hysteria?”

“Puccini’s musical construction is cunning, and perhaps immorally, even femininely illogical. But his unconditional mastery and control over his material and his own intentions ensure that it appears honest, brutally straightforward and dazzlingly logical. His orchestration is thus among the most brilliant, interesting and sensationally detailed of all new composers. In this regard, only Wagner, Goldmark, Delibes and Tchaikovsky come close to him. The cantilena of his violins is superbly intense and sweet. His flutes, oboes and clarinets inspire uniquely strange and distinguished perfumes. The cellos, bolstered by the horns and bassoons, swell with soft and

caressing songs. The trumpets crackle like frayed nerves, or sob behind their mutes like the repressed aches of the heart. The runs of the harp are light and airy, as if tiny, barefoot fairies were flitting across the strings, and they represent eager waves of great, unfulfilled desires. The double basses, along with the bassoons, bang, roar and chime... And if we peer into the score, it appears as if this music wasn’t imagined for an orchestra at all, but as if the whole thing were some rare, fortunate but affected orchestration for improvised piano. The tones are spread thickly, even smudged. As if the composer had, quite unreasonably and improperly, doubled, tripled, or quadrupled certain parts. The violins climb into upper regions of intense sound. The harp, without any apparent intent, plays in unison with some other instrument, comparable to a piano being placed in the orchestra and given a melody to be played on only a single finger. And yet everything is in its ideal place, at its perfect pitch, in its most natural state. After all, every student of music knows that the higher tones of the oboe are shrill, that the flute is weak in its lower register, and that in lower positions the horn tends to crackle and is hard to control, etc. But beyond this knowledge, for someone to understand the nature of so many instruments so well, and to feel them so naturally as Puccini did, is truly rare. The orchestras of Wagner and Goldmark are similarly colourful, but when placed side by side, their colours lack the airy, magnificently brilliant economy of Puccini’s.

“Today, he is among the greatest. And whether he will be great tomorrow, or the day after – why should this concern us?”
